ALL PET LICENSES ARE NOW LATE AND WILL BE ASSESED PENALTIES.

<u>Starting on March 1st there will be a \$5</u> fee placed on each pet for each month that it is not licensed on time.</u>

FORMS WERE MAILED; HOWEVER, THE CITY WEBSITE HAS FORMS AVAILABLE AND CITY HALL. <u>A completed application</u> form and up-to-date rabies vaccination is required.

YELLOW LEVEL WATER <u>MANDATORY</u> WATER RESTRICTIONS NOW IN PLACE!

- A. Outdoor watering or irrigation of lawns is prohibited.
- B. Outdoor watering of any kind is prohibited between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. daily.
- C. Water or irrigation of flower and vegetable gardens, trees and shrubs less than 4 years old, and new seeding or sod is permitted once per week with an application not to exceed one inch.
- D. Car washing is prohibited except in commercial establishments that provide that service. In these cases, hours of use will be restricted to 8:00 am to 8:00 PM.
- E. No water shall be used to fill private/residential swimming pools, children's wading pools, reflecting pools, or any other outdoor pool or pond.
- F. No water shall be used to wash streets, parking lots, driveways, sidewalks, or building exteriors.
- G. Large volume water users, including industries, motels, hotels, and eating establishments may be requested to scale back services.
- H. Schools will be required to cancel their physical education activities and inter-scholastic competitions that require showers or attract crowds and take other actions to reduce water consumption at sport complex.
- I. Water shall be served at restaurants only upon the request of the customer.

Attention: the City of Avoca has approved a new Emergency Parking Ordinance.

Please read to learn the new rules regarding parking during and immediately after winter weather events.

ORDINANCE NO. 2024-02

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF AVOCA, IOWA, BY AMENDING PROVISIONS PERTAIN-ING TO SNOW EMERGENCY PARKING

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Avoca, Iowa:

SECTION 1. SECTION MODIFIED. Section 5.6(P) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Avoca, Iowa, is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

P. Snow Emergency Parking. No person shall park, abandon, or leave unattended any vehicle on any public street, alley, or City-owned off-street parking area during a declared snow emergency in violation of this paragraph.

1. Declaration. The City Administrator or their designee shall have the authority to declare a snow emergency and publicize the declaration within the community in all manners available when conditions of snow and ice accumulation are imminent or existing on the City streets.

2. Parking. Upon the declaration of a snow emergency parking shall be prohibited as follows:

a. East-West Streets. Parking shall be prohibited on the north side of all east-west streets for the first 24 hours of a declared emergency. Once snow has been fully removed from the north side of the street parking shall be prohibited on the south side of the street for a period of 24 hours.

b. North-South Streets. Parking shall be prohibited on the east side of all north-south streets for the first 24 hours of a declared emergency. Once snow has been fully removed from the east side of the street parking shall be prohibited on the west side of the street for a period of 24 hours.

c. City-Owned Off-Street Parking. Parking shall be prohibited from all City-owned off-street parking areas until such time as the snow or ice has been removed.

d. Alleys. Parking in alleys shall be prohibited for the duration of the declared snow emergency.

3. No Parking Prohibitation Temporary Suspension. In cases where one side of the street has prohibited parking year around that prohibition shall be temporarily suspended for the purposes of compliance with the City's snow emergency parking regulations. For example, in a case where Unnamed Street has a no parking ban on the south side of the street that parking prohibition shall be temporarily suspended when parking is prohibited by the snow emergency declaration on the north side of Unnamed Street.

4. Penalty. A violation of the snow emergency parking regulations shall result in a scheduled fine of \$25.00. The City shall also have the right to have any vehicle violating the snow emergency parking regulations towed at the owners expense in addition to a scheduled fine.

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 3. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.
