As a non-profit organization, Avoca Main Street's Board of Directors oversees staff and volunteer efforts to promote economic development in our downtown district through historic preservation and community development. The volunteer-based organization began in 2014 through a partnership with the Iowa Department of Economic Authority.

Board elections where held on September 27, 2023 at our Annual Public Meeting. Ending their terms on the Board of Directors were Linda Hansen, who concluded two consecutive three-year terms as Treasurer and continues to serve as a member of the Design Committee, and Ty Thornock.

New elected members agree to serve the mission of the organization, to serve on one of our four committees: Design, Economic Vitality, Organization, or Promotions, and to receive Orientation to the Main Street Program through Main Street Iowa. Until Further Notice

YELLOW WATER RESTRICTION STILL IN PLACE:

As a reminder, municipal, residential, agricultural, commercial, and industrial users are still required to observe the following mandatory reduction measures:

- 1. No outdoor watering or irrigation of any kind between the hours of 8:00 AM to 8:00 PM. **No watering or irrigation of lawns whatsoever.** Watering of flowers, vege-table gardens, trees or shrubs less than four years old, and new seedlings and sod is permitted once per week, with an application not to exceed one inch and only between the hours of 8:00 PM to 8:00 AM.
- 2. No car washing is allowed, except at commercial establishments that provide that service as their only means of income. In these cases, hours of use will be restricted to 8:00 AM to 8:00 PM.
- 3. No water shall be used to fill private swimming pools, children's wading pools, or similar articles.
- 4. No water shall be used to clean streets, driveways, sidewalks, etc.
- 5. Large volume water users, including industries, motels, hotels, eating establishments, and livestock confinements may be requested to scale back services and/or production. <u>This includes spraying operations.</u>
- 6. Schools are strongly urged to cancel their physical education activities and inter-scholastic competitions that require showers or attract crowds and take other actions to reduce water consumption.
